- A. Jesus' return will be different than His first coming to this earth
 - 1st coming: to save the world which deserved to be condemned John 3:17
 - a. He came to seek sinners and to be condemned for them
 - b. He is still coming 'in our midst through His Word' to seek us
 - 2nd coming: to save His people and bring them to new earth Rev. 21:1-3
 - a. What will be new about the new heaven and earth?

JESUS' PROMISE TO THE GOD-FEARING

A. Who are the God-fearing? B. What is His promise to the God-fearing?

I. WHO ARE THE GOD-FEARING?

- A. God-fearing children are those who love the Lord Jesus, His Father and Spirit
 - 1. To 'fear God' is to treat Him like you treat someone very special to you
 - a. because you love Him, therefore you want to please Him
 - b. because you love Him, therefore you want to be near Him
 - c. because you love Him, therefore you want to respect and defend Him
 - d. because you love Him, therefore you feel sad about offending Him
 - e. because you love Him, therefor you want to be like Him
 - 2. Do not think children that fear or love or esteem God are perfect in that

II. WHAT IS JESUS' PROMISE TO THOSE WHO FEAR THE LORD?

- A. If you are a *God-fearing* boy or girl, your future is bright and glorious
- B. His promise is that He is coming to finish what HE has begun in you
 - 1. He shall complete free us from sin: ye shall go forth (vs. 2b)
 - 2. He shall fill us with unbounded joy: grow up as calves of the stall (vs. 2c)

Final: Though dark storm clouds are packing up, the Sun of Righteous will come
