THE FAILURE OF EARTHLY SUCCESS

ECCLESIASTES 1:12-2:26 (ESV)

INTRODUCTION

The message of Ecclesiastes: What the world calls success is not truly success.

"Our greatest fear should not be of failure, but of succeeding at something that doesn't really matter." – **D.L. Moody**

"Only One Life, 'Twill soon be past, Only what is done for Christ will Last" – C.T. Studd

Today's message is a warning for us to not live for earthly success, but instead to discover what <u>eternal</u> success truly is.

WISDOM

'qoheleth' = preacher / someone who assembles others to teach wisdom

Not all pursuits of wisdom are wise.

James 3:13–15–[13] Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. [14] But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. [15] This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic.

Jeremiah 9:23–24–[23] Thus says the LORD: "Let not the wise man boast in his wisdom, let not the mighty man boast in his might, let not the rich man boast in his riches, [24] but let him who boasts boast in this, that he understands and knows me, that I am the LORD who practices steadfast love, justice, and righteousness in the earth. For in these things I delight, declares the LORD."

1 Corinthians 3:19–20–[19] For the wisdom of this world is folly with God. For it is written, "He catches the wise in their craftiness," [20] and again, "The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are futile."

What makes earthly wisdom vain?

- 1. Earthly wisdom does not affect real change.
- 2. Earthly wisdom only further exposes us to the brokenness of the world.
- 3. Earthly wisdom bears no impact in <u>eternity</u>.

We look for wisdom in the gospel.

1 Corinthians 1:21–24–[21] For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. [22] For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, [23] but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, [24] but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.

PLEASURE

hedonism = <u>maximizing</u> pleasure / minimizing pain

The pursuit of pleasure for pleasure sake will not give your life purpose.

The problem is not that the preacher pursued pleasure, but that he pursued pleasure for <u>himself</u>.

Psalm 1:2–[2] but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.

Psalm 16:11–[11] You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore.

Psalm 37:4–[4] Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

We look for pleasure in the gospel.

2 Corinthians 5:15–[15] and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

WORK

Work was established <u>before</u> sin entered the world.

Genesis 2:15–[15] The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it.

John 5:17–[17] But Jesus answered them, "My Father is working until now, and I am working."

Work was not established in the fall, but it's very much <u>affected by it</u>.

Not only is work hard, you can't <u>carry</u> your work into eternity.

For the believer, our labors bear fruit of <u>eternal life</u>.

1 Corinthians 15:58–[58] Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.
