Christian, don't go back to the slavery of trying to relate to God through your effort—through trying to keep the old covenant law.

According to Genesis 16-22, God's promised blessing to all nations will not come through Hagar's son Ishmael (who was born when Abraham failed to trust God and attempted to bring God's promises to pass through his own effort). It will come through Sarai's miraculous son Isaac (whom Abraham could do nothing to produce, except simply trust God).

FOR GALATIANS 4:21–31

- 2. Remember the time when Abram stopped trusting God and took matters into his own hands (Genesis 16–22).
- 3. Remember the expectation that Israel as a nation would fail to obey God's law (Exodus 19 Deuteronomy 30).

According to the law itself, God's promised blessing to all nations will come only after the whole nation of Israel had failed to obey God's law. Only then would God begin (en masse) to miraculously change people's hearts so they'd love and obey him.
