- I. The Covenant Structure of the Great Commission.¹ Every covenant has the following five points:
 - A. **Transcendance** "Who is in charge here?" (vv. 16-18)
 - B. **Hierarchy** "To whom do I report?" (v. vv. 18-19a)
 - C. **Covenant Oath** "Is there accountability?" ("baptizing" v. 19b)
 - D. **Stipulations** "What are the rules of this outfit?"(v. 20a)
 - E. **Provisions for Covenant Succession** "Does this outfit have a future?" (v. 20b)
- II. The Comprehensiveness of our Mandate
 - A. The comprehensive extent of Christ's present authority ("All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth" none shared with Satan or other rivals)
 - B. The comprehensive prospect of victory ("go therefore and disciple <u>all</u> the nations" not just a remnant)
 - C. The comprehensive standard for change ("teaching them to observe <u>all</u> things whatsoever $[\pi\alpha\nu\tau\alpha\ \delta\sigma\alpha]$ I commanded you" not just the Gospel)
 - D. The permanence of Christ's victorious presence with the church ("and lo I am with you <u>all</u> the days [πασας τας 'ημερας] until the completion of the age" rather than waiting for His presence)
