The Westminster Larger Catechism, Questions 1-3

<u>Leader</u>: How doth it appear that the Scriptures are the Word of God?

All: The Scriptures manifest themselves to be the Word of God, by their majesty and purity; by the consent of all the parts, and the scope of the whole, which is to give all glory to God; by their light and power to convince and convert sinners, to comfort and build up believers unto salvation: but the Spirit of God bearing witness by and with the Scriptures in the heart of man, is alone able fully to persuade it that they are the very Word of God.

All: The Scriptures principally teach, what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man.

Genesis 16.7-16

She said, "I am fleeing from my mistress Sarai." ⁹The angel of the Lord said to her, "Return to your mistress and submit to her." ¹⁰The angel of the Lord also said to her, "I will surely multiply your offspring so that they cannot be numbered for multitude." ¹¹And the angel of the Lord said to her, "Behold, you are pregnant and shall bear a son. Jesus! what a Strength in weakness! Let me hide myself in Him.


Tempted, tried, and sometimes failing, He, my Strength, my victory wins.

• A crisis pregnancy

• Truly poor: no one to call

When it hurts

The Help for Hager, 16.7-9

• Abraham: not looking

- Found by: The Angel of the Lord
 - New character
 - First mention
 - Pre-incarnate Jesus
 - She knows he is God, cf. verse 13
- Jesus finds her, Isaiah 61.1a-b
- Jesus has her tell her story, 16.8
 - Like he did with the woman at the well, John 4
- God finds us
- Hagar: limited options
 - In Egypt, prostitution or slavery
 - Security with Abraham
 - Running away, but not running towards
- A hard word: return, 16.9
 - We'd rather run from a problem than confront it
- About being a victim, I Peter 2.18-23

The Hope for Hager, 16.10-14

- The promise to Hagar, 16.10-12
 - o Ishmael: God hears
 - o Everybody's hurt is known to God
 - Vaclav Havel: Hope is not the conviction that something will turn out well, but the certainty that something makes sense, regardless of how it turns out
- The response of Hager, 16.13-14
 - Only person in the Old Testament who gives God a name
 - o The longest conversation of any woman in the Old Testament with God
 - God sees... God cares
 - She did not even know she needed God
- Our need to be seen: our need for significance and safety
 - o Psalm 139.16; Jeremiah 24.6; Zechariah 2.8

Hagar Goes Home, 16.15-16

- A second chance
- They believe her story
- But it is not happily ever after... that's only for eternity, not this world

So What About Us?

- In the shoes of...
 - o Hagar
 - o Abraham and Sarah
 - o Jesus
- God sees... and cares
