"Jew" in the Gospel of John:

We are going to see this in two words and two ideas that come from this passage.

I. AMAZED, V. 15

This is a word that could mean amazed in a good way. "Wow, this teaching is amazing, I love it!"

But it could also be amazing in a bad way, as with skepticism, incredulity or astonishment. "Who does this guy think He is?

The context determines whether we are to take it as being a good amazement or a bad amazement. The word shows up six times in the Gospel. Five of the six times it is to be taken negatively.
