## BIBLE DISCUSSION GROUP STUDY QUESTIONS

In preparation for Sunday, December 4, 2022 Passage: Isaiah 24:1-23

Memory Passage: Isaiah 24:3

# DAY 1 – ASK FOR INSIGHT

**READ THE PASSAGE** 

- (a) **Read Is. 24:1-25:12**. Just as chapters 13-23 form one section (oracles concerning the nations), chapters 24-27 form one section of thought. Today and tomorrow, we will overview these four chapters.
- (b) Read chapters 24 and 25, taking note of (1) repeated words or phrases, (2) major subdivisions of the text, (3) speaker & audience, (4) message, (5) tone, and (6) time (i.e., when in history the events happen, if we are told).

### DAY 2 – ASK FOR INSIGHT

**READ THE PASSAGE** 

- (a) **Read Is. 26:1-27:13**. Read chapters 26 & 27, taking note of (1) repeated words or phrases, (2) major subdivisions of the text, (3) speaker & audience, (4) message, (5) tone, and (6) time (i.e., when in history the events happen, if we are told).
- (b) Write one paragraph describing how the overarching themes of the chapters fit together to tell one narrative.
- (c) How do these chapters connect with chapters 13-23 (think of phrases and themes you've already encountered and how they are echoed or reversed, etc.)?

#### DAY 3 – ASK FOR INSIGHT

**READ THE PASSAGE** 

- (a) **Read Is. 24:1-23**. What event does 24:1-6 describe, and what justification is given for it?
- (b) What is the relationship between human sin and God's creation?
- (c) What do the images and their meaning tell us about the "wasted city" in vs. 7-12)?

(d) To whom do verses 13-16a refer, and how do they compare to those spoken of in verses 7-12?

## DAY 4 – ASK FOR INSIGHT

### **READ THE PASSAGE**

- (a) **Read Is. 24:1-23**. To what theme does 24:16b-20 return? How do these verses add to that theme?
- (b) Who will Yahweh punish "on that day," according to v. 21? What does this tell you about the extent of this judgment?
- (c) In what ways are you reminded of Genesis (esp. chapters 3 & 11) as you study Isaiah 24?
- (d) In what ways are you reminded of the Scripture's teaching about future judgment?

### DAY 5 – ASK FOR INSIGHT

## **READ THE PASSAGE**

- (a) **Read Is. 24:1-23**. What do you learn about God, man, sin, creation, and judgment from Isaiah 24?
- (b) How does this passage guide you as you live in the "already-not-yet" of the kingdom of God?
- (c) In what ways are you challenged to change your daily activities as a result of studying this passage?
- (d) How does Isaiah chapter 24 help you know how to respond to God's ongoing, though not yet final, judgment of the world?
