# Question # 175: What is the Duty of Christians, After They Have Received the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper? Answer:

The duty of Christians, after they have received the sacrament of the Lord's supper, is seriously to consider how they have behaved themselves therein, and with what success;<sup>a</sup> if they find quickening and comfort, to bless God for it,<sup>b</sup> beg the continuance of it,<sup>c</sup> watch against relapses,<sup>d</sup> fulfil their vows,<sup>e</sup> and encourage themselves to a frequent attendance on that ordinance:<sup>f</sup> but if they find no present benefit, more exactly to review their preparation to, and carriage at, the sacrament;<sup>g</sup> in both which, if they can approve themselves to God and their own consciences, they are to wait for the fruit of it in due time:<sup>h</sup> but, if they see they have failed in either, they are to be humbled,<sup>i</sup> and to attend upon it afterwards with more care and diligence.<sup>j</sup>
