Note the key word "remember":

- Deut 5.15 **remember** that you were a slave in Egypt & the Lord your God brought you out
- Deut 8.18 **remember** the LORD your God!
- Jude 17 you, beloved, ought to <u>remember</u> the words spoken by the apostles...
- Rev 3.3 **remember** what you have received & heard.
- 1 Cor 11 this is my body .. And blood; do this in **remembrance** of me!

We need to **remember** because we so often **forget!**

Return to this [the Lord's Supper] and revive this, make a solemn business of that powerful & binding ordinance, and then, it is to be hoped, that there will be a reformation in other places as well (Matthew Henry).

Background to 2 Chronicles 35

- You'll recall that as they remodeled the Temple (2 Chron 34), they **found the Book of the Law** & read it to Josiah!
- Undoubtedly he heard Deuteronomy 16.1-2, 6! Celebrate the passover!

THESIS — See the glory of God in raising up a godly & biblical Josiah in such wicked & apostate times. See his commitment to Scripture, the Passover & Truth.

- looking back: DON'T FORGET TO REMEMBER THE LAMB! [prioritize the Lamb]
- looking ahead: DON'T NEGLECT YOUR MAIN CALLING! [pursue your duties!]

I. LOOKING BACK! PRIORITIZETHE LAMB! (1-19)

Josiah's passover:

- 1. the *occasion* (Egypt) -> remembering bondage in Egypt
- 2. the offering (Lamb) -> substitutionary lamb
- 3. the order/ordinances (What does the Bible say?) he is following Scripture
- 1. Preparation (1-6)
- 2. **Provision** (7-9)
- 3. **Procedure** (10-15)

4. Praise & preeminence of the Passover (16-19)

II.LOOKING AHEAD! PURSUE YOUR DUTIES! (20-27)

O how timely for us in a culture of distractions. Like ocean waves, distractions just keep coming our way. It could be that many good things could keep us from *The Great* thing.

- I.The distraction (20)
- 2. The **meddling** (21-22)
 - ✓ Proverbs 26.17 like one who takes a dog by the ears is he who passes by and meddles with strife not belonging to him.
 - ✓ Proverbs 3:30 do not contend with a man without cause, if he has done you no harm!
 - ✓ 1 Thess 4.11 make it your ambition to lead a quiet life, and attend to your own business.
- 3. His **wounding & death** (23-24)
- 4. His **legacy** (25-27)

Connecting the Passover of old to the Lord's Supper/Work of Christ:

- 1 Cor 5.7 Christ our <u>Passover</u> has been sacrificed.
 - the **PERSON** Christ...
 - the **PASSOVER** our Passover
 - the PERSONAL (our) "our"
 - the **PASSIVE** (God did the killing) has been
 - the **PROPITIATION** (sacrificed) sacrificed/killed/slaughtered

The Passover lamb was an innocent creature, yet if the Paschal lamb be once made a sacrifice, it must be killed. Though Christ were so unblemished, yet, if he will stoop to the office of a substitute, he must pay our debt, and do that which we should have done, namely DIED for sin.

We ought carefully and with the utmost seriousness and consideration attend the sacrament of the Lord's Supper: this was appointed for this end, to draw forth longings of our souls toward Jesus Christ. Here are the glorious objects of spiritual desire by visible signs represented to our view. We have Christ evidently set forth crucified.... Here we have that spiritual meat and drink represented and offered to excite our hunger and thirst; here we have all that spiritual feast represented which God has provided for poor souls; and here we may hope in some measure to have our longing souls satisfied in this world by the gracious communications of the Spirit of God. (Jonathan Edwards)

According to Paul in 1 Corinthians 11:17-34, the Lord's Supper is several things all wrapped into one. It is first an opportunity to express the unity of the church (vv. 18-19, 33). It is therefore, second, a fellowship of God's people (vv. 20-21, 33). Third, it is intended as a symbolic remembrance of Christ's sinless life and atoning death on our behalf (vv. 24-25). Fourth, it is intended as a proclamation of Christ's death, resurrection, and return (v. 26). And fifth, it is a built-in opportunity for self-examination (vv. 28-29). (Mark Dever)

The benefits [the Lord's Supper] confers, are spiritual, not physical. Its effects must be looked for in our inward man. It was intended to remind us, by the visible, tangible emblems of bread and wine, that the offering of Christ's body and blood for us on the cross, is the only atonement for sin, and the life of a believer's soul. It was meant to help our poor weak faith to closer fellowship with our crucified Savior, and to assist us in spiritually feeding on Christ's body and blood. It is an ordinance for redeemed sinners, and not for unfallen angels. By receiving it we publicly declare our sense of guilt, and need of a Savior — our trust in Jesus, and our love to Him — our desire to live upon Him, and our hope to live with Him. Using it in this spirit, we shall find our repentance deepened, our faith increased, our hope brightened, and our love enlarged — our besetting sins weakened, and our graces strengthened. It will draw us nearer to Christ. . . .

Do we turn away from [the Lord's Table] when it is administered? If so, how can we justify our conduct? It will not do to say it is not a necessary ordinance. To say so is to pour contempt on Christ Himself, and declare that we do not obey Him. It will not do to say that we feel unworthy to come to the Lord's table. To say so is to declare that we are unfit to die, and unprepared to meet God. These are solemn considerations. All non-communicants should ponder them well. . . .

Are we in the habit of coming to the Lord's table? If so, in what frame of mind do we come? Do we draw near intelligently, humbly, and with faith? Do we understand what we are doing? Do we really feel our sinfulness and need of Christ? Do we really desire to live a Christian life, as well as profess the Christian faith? Happy is that soul who can give a satisfactory answer to these questions. Let him go forward, and persevere.
