Matthew 27:45-54

Big Idea: In his dying, Jesus was forsaken by God; but in his death, he was vindicated.

The Old Covenant Priesthood and Temple Rendered Obsolete

The New Covenant Offering Finished, Providing Unhindered Access to the Holy One Enthroned between the Cherubim

B. The Earth Shaken and Rocks Torn (verse 51b)

Such shaking is a characteristic manifestation of God's holy presence.

Such shaking is often also a sign of creation being overturned by its Creator.

- C. The Tombs Opened and Saints Raised (verses 52–53)
- D. The Executioners' Confession (verse 54)
