The command of wisdom. "Forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments" (Proverbs 3:1). The command is twofold. First, the Interest in the
Word. "Forget not my law". Our devotion to the Word of God is vital to keeping the
Word of God. Daily Bible and is necessary to keep from
what God has said. Disinterest in the Word of God results in forgetting
what God has said and written down for us. Second, the doing of the Word. "Let
thine heart keep my commandments." The most powerful way to not forget God's
commandments is by obeying His Word! It is one thing to hear but then to put that knowledge into daily living is powerful!
• The compensation of wisdom. "For length of days, and long life, and peace, shall
they add to thee" (Proverbs 3:2). To keep the command to not forget the Word of God
and to do what the Holy Bible says will add time and tranquility to one's life. Psalm
55:23 "bloody and deceitful men shall not live out half their days". We have the
example of Absolom, who was a deceitful man. He died at a young age. Look at II
