A. My <u>brother</u>, fellow <u>worker</u>, and fellow <u>soldier</u>

Adelphos – brother (male sibling); fellow <u>believer;</u> fellow Jew; neighbor

*Synergós* – fellow <u>worker</u>

#### B. Your messenger and minister

Apostolos – 1. a <u>delegate</u>, messenger, one sent forth with <u>orders</u> 2. specifically applied to the twelve apostles of Christ

2 Corinthians 8:23

*Leitourgos* – 1. a public <u>minister</u>, a servant of the state 2. a minister, <u>servant</u>

Romans 15:16

- C. Paul sends him back to Philippi
  - 1. Epaphroditus longed for them to see him well
  - 2. Receive him with gladness and esteem

Parabouleuomai – risk one's life, expose to danger
