The Blessings of Being Forgiven Psalm 32

Introduction: What is it that makes one truly happy in life?

Context: David's sin of adultery (with Bathsheba) and murder (of Uriah)

Psalm 51:1-13

Sin and forgiveness (1-2):

Transgression (*peshah*) = rebellion against God

Sin (*cattath*) = missing the mark, straying from the way

Iniquity (*hawon*) = crooked

Forgives – lift off, take away, bear the burden

Covers - clothe the nakedness (shame)

Does not impute - cancellation of the debt and exchange for Christ's righteousness

Three OT illustrations of forgiveness – Psalm 103:12, Micah 7:18-19, Jeremiah 31:34

The Gospel – Psalm 32:1-2 & Romans 4:1-8, 24-25

Confession of sin (3-5):

The consequences of unconfessed sin

The blessing of believers confessing sin (1 John 1:9-10)

Repentance, Safety and Worship (6-11):

Today is the day of salvation - repent while He is near

God's goodness – He will teach, lead and lead you to repentance

A call to rejoice in the God who saves!

Application: Why do we remain silent and not confess our sins? (James 5:13-16)

- 1. Pride, shame, fear of man
- 2. The worldly "right to privacy"
- 3. The worldly lie of perfectionism
- 4. The law shoulds and oughts
- 5. Judgementalism be a humble vessel that people want to come to
- 6. Not knowing that what we are doing is sin requires loving confrontation
