the sons are free (v. 26)

Compulsory giving vs. Cheerful giving (2 Corinthians 9:6-15)

not to give offense (v. 27)

We are free ... to love others

Take care how you live before others, especially when it comes to money

Pay your taxes (Romans 13:1-7)

Let your love for others exceed your love for money and your love for your freedom and rights.

 – The greatest in the kingdom of heaven: Self-denying love redirects ambition and directs us to humility

unless you turn and become like children (v. 3)

a child's low rank in society children lack self-importance children are dependent children readily accept gifts

Have you received the free gift of eternal life in Christ Jesus?

Whoever humbles himself like this child (v. 4)

Humility: What it is and what it is not

Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me (v. 5)

How do we receive "little people?" (children, needy, other Christians)
