Introduction

- God has created us as emotional beings!
- All of us respond emotionally to what we see, hear, or experience.
- When people understand what the Scriptures are saying, their first response is usually emotional. They "feel" something.

Feelings and God's Word A. The People felt SORROW!

- 1. The Law expresses the holiness of God, and how it was possible for a Holy God to be approached by holy people. Deuteronomy 28:9-14, 49
- 2. In hearing the Law, the people realized how sinful they were.
 - a. The Law was not the means of a person's salvation.
 - b. The Law shows how sinful we are. Romans 7:7, 12, 13
- 3. In hearing the Law, the people realized that their current situation was due to their disobedience.
- 4. There is definitely a time and place for sorrow when hearing God's Word.—James 4:7-10; Hebrews 4:12; 2 Corinthians 7:9-11
- 5. But, this is NOT the time!?

B. The Leaders urge JOY!

- 1. Why???—"This day is sacred to the LORD, your God."
 - a. Feast of Trumpets-Numbers 29
 - b. "New Year's Day"—time to be reminded that God is King!—Psalm 47:1; 96:1-4; 98:1, 4-6; 99:1-3
- 2. "But I don't feel like celebrating!"
 - a. Our Obedience to God and His Word is NOT driven by feelings!
 - 1) Today, "If I feel like it, I will"
 - 2) Ezra's reluctance to push for decisions—emotionalism
 - 3) Jesus and the pitfall of emotionalism—Matthew 13:20-21
 - b. Our Joy is NOT dependent upon our circumstances.—James 1:2-3; Philippians 1:18; 4:10-19; 4:1
 1) Our Joy is found in experiencing the presence of God.—Deuteronomy 12:7, 18; 14:27
 - 2) Our Joy is found through understanding and obeying God's Word.—Nehemiah 8:12
 a) Great joy in the Word of God—Jeremiah 15:16; Psalm 19:8
 - b) Great joy obeying God's Word
