## Sequence of Events

1. Assyria destroys Israel with its capital Samaria – 722 BC
2. Assyria continues military campaign (including Judah)
3. King Hezekiah tries but fails to intervene through alliances, financial tributes, and defensive planning
4. **King Hezekiah acquires mortal illness – 702 BC (Is 38)**
  - **2 Kings 20:1-11; 2 Chronicles 32:24; Isaiah 38**
    - a. **Isaiah tells Hezekiah his illness is mortal**
    - b. **Hezekiah prays and weeps**
    - c. **Isaiah returns before even leaving the palace to tell Hezekiah he will be given 15 more years**
    - d. **Isaiah also tells Hezekiah he will go up to the house of the LORD on the third day**
    - e. **Isaiah orders a fig remedy for the illness**
    - f. **Hezekiah asks for a sign**
    - g. **Isaiah asks Hezekiah if the shadow should advance or retreat ten steps**
    - h. **Hezekiah chooses “retreat” (it’s harder!)**
    - i. **The shadow retreats 10 steps**
    - j. **The fig remedy is applied to Hezekiah**
    - k. **Hezekiah asks for a sign to confirm that he will go up to the house of the LORD**
    - l. **Hezekiah is healed**
    - m. **Hezekiah writes a psalm about the occasion**
5. Babylonian envoys visit Hezekiah (Isaiah 39)
6. Jerusalem is threatened by Assyrians – 701 BC (Is 36)
7. The Angel of the LORD kills 185,000 Assyrians (Is 37)
8. Manasseh is born in 699 BC & begins reign in 687 BC
9. Babylon destroys Jerusalem; remnant in exile – 586 BC
