Five Necessary Elements of Churches that have Power

I. They feared God more than man - vv18-20

The only way to lose a fear of man is to fear God more, and trust Him implicitly without hesitation or reservation.

II. They gathered together with the saints and lifted their voices to God – vv23-24

Peter encouraged suffering saints to yield themselves to the faithful Creator (1 Peter 4:19).
