#### The Temple in Eden (Genesis 2:4–17)

Humanity's original home, Eden, wasn't just a garden; it was a *temple*, revealing that God designed human life to be lived with him—in his presence.

### Marriage in Eden (Genesis 2:18–25)

Understanding God's good design for human relationships—especially his design for marriage—is crucial for human flourishing.

#### Scripture Reading

## GENESIS 2:15–17

#### 1. What's going on in Genesis 2:15–17?

To *know* of good and evil is to *determine* good and evil, "an assertion of human autonomy."

A covenant refers to binding promises between people that define their relationship.

This is a binding covenant in which "the punishment, sadly, fits the crime."

#### THE MAIN POINT

God designed humans to have a relationship with him through binding covenant promises. You can't relate with God (and have no chance of human flourishing) if there's no covenant binding you and God.
