TZADIY ۲, ۲

Y (*TZA-dee*) is the 18th letter of the Hebrew *alef-beyt*. The ancient symbol/letter for tzadiy is a man on his side...

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The modern tzadiy (x) has a sound resembling the English "ts" or "tz" sound, as in 'nu<u>ts</u>.' A few common words beginning with tzadiy are....

צאֹן (*tzōn*) means "sheep" or "flock" (Gen 4:2) ציצת (*tzee-TZEET*) means "fringes" (Num 15:38-39) ציצת (*tzootz*) means "flower" or "blossom" (Num 17:8)

Tzadiy is feminine in gender, and by its ancient pictograph, means "wait," "hunt," "chase," or "snare."

As the 18th letter, tzadiy has the numerical value of '90.' Because tzadiy has a final form (γ), tzadiy sofiyt has a numerical value of '900.'

Two tzadiy words are used in Jeremiah 23:5-6 for two of Messiah's titles: "Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will raise up for David <u>a</u> <u>righteous Branch</u>, and He shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. **v6** In His days Judah will be saved, and Israel will dwell securely. And this is the name by which He will be called: <u>'The LORD is our righteousness</u>.'" Branch = שמח (tze-MACH), Righteous = עדיק (tzad-DEEQ). The Lord Jesus is the צמח צריק and He will be called (YHVH tzid-qe-NU).

PSALM 119:137-144 TZADIY WORDS

- **v137** צדיק (*tzad-DEEQ*) = "righteous" or "just"
- While the Bible-believing Christian cannot conceive of an unrighteous God, the truth of God's pure righteousness is oft foreign to us because of the sin that so easily besets us. (Rom 11:33)
- **v138** צוית (*tziv-vee-TA*) = "You appointed" or "You commanded" While God's testimonies have been commanded to us, they have been appointed for Christ's fulfillment in Christ's righteousness. (Psa 40:7-8)
- **v139** צמתתני (*tzim-TAT-neey*) = "I am consumed" We should either be consumed with zeal for Christ, or be empowered to be refreshing unto Christ & to others for Christ's sake. (Rev 3:15-16)
- **v140** צרופה (*tz'-ru-FAH*) = "tested," "tried," "proven" as in smelting We are tested to force impurities to the surface where they may be dealt with, but God's Word (like Christ) reveals its purity. (Psa 12:6)
- **v141** צעיר (*tza-IYR*) = "small," "least," "little," "youngest," "few" The Lord Jesus became least in His Father's house & Servant of all. (Luke 22:27)
- **v142** צדקתך (*tzid-qat-KHA*) = "Your righteousness" Jesus was, is, & evermore shall be righteous. (Heb 13:8)
- v143 צר־ומצוק (*tzar oo-ma-TZOQ*) = "trouble and anguish" On the night Jesus was betrayed, he prayed in Olivet's garden in anguish, & trouble (Judas & the Sanhedrin guard) found Him. (Luke 22:44, 47)
- **v144** נ*TZE-deq*) = "just," "right," "righteous," "justice" The testimonies of Christ are as righteous as the character of His person; Jesus, the living Word, is the embodiment of the written Word. (v142; John 1:1, 14)

CHALLENGE

Righteous are You, O LORD, and right are Your rules. Psalm 119:137, ESV

<u>Challenge</u>: Memorize **v137** in your favorite Bible version. Each morning when you rise, consider the righteousness of the Lord Jesus Christ – do so for ascending minutes (1 min. Thursday, then add a minute each day until Wednesday morning when you consider thoughts of Christ's righteousness for 7 min.). Each morning jot down with pencil and paper your thought & response. Prepare to share one blessing from these meditations next week.

What to Pray for This Week:

- 1. May the blessed truth of Your Word minister to us as we pray.
- 2. May our prayers begin sounding like those prayed in Scripture because You're conforming our lives to Christ.
- 3. May our focus in prayer be upon You, and not for the ears of man.
- 4. Pour out Your Spirit upon Christ's church, and upon the world.
- 5. Purify Your children, and unite us to worship You in Christ, with one heart, one mind and one accord.
- 6. Raise up godly ministers unto Your harvest, and bless those who are already laboring in Your field.
- 7. Be merciful unto us by bringing saving faith to our unsaved family, friends, neighbors, the village of Ninilchik, and all the residents of the Kenai Peninsula.
- 8. Remove from us all pride, haughtiness and arrogance, and make us ever watchful against the flesh and every temptation from the enemy.
- 9. Humble us as we commune with You in prayer, and keep us from lipservice, from deedless word religion and heartless works religion.
- 10. Teach us to abide in Christ each time we pray; that our hearts may be knit to His so we may glorify You.

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
