New Year Necessities Back to Basics: Prayer Hebrews 4:14-16

INTRODUCTION

We return to our series **New Year Necessities - Back to Basics**. Last time we considered the need and the value of God's Word. And in His word, we find an invite to approach God through prayer. In your Bible, please turn to **Hebrews 4:14-16**.

We forget to our own peril that prayer was a vital part of the early church. They were devoted to the prayers (Acts 2:42). These brothers and sisters prayed corporately. They valued joining their hearts together in prayer - Acts 4, 12, 14. Sadly, this has changed in our day. Prayer is the most-often talked about but least practiced spiritual discipline in the Christian life. Prayerlessness is a declaration of independence from God. We forget that what we are on our knees in secret before God Almighty, that we are and no more. The prayer life of any church is the best barometer of its health...the prayer life of this church is the best barometer of its health.

Here's the good news: the God who speaks to us through His word is the God who also is inclined to listen! Not only does He express Himself and bid us hear His voice, but He wants to hear ours. The speaking God not only has spoken, but He also listens; He wants to hear from you. He stands ready to hear your voice. Christian, you have the ear of God. We call it prayer.

Prayer, simply put, is talking to God. It is relational. Prayer is simply conversing with God. It is communion with God. We converse with people all the time. Husbands and wives talk together. Close friends get together to visit. Prayer is just doing with God, what you do with people all the time. We can't have a close relationship with another person without spending time communicating with them. It's exactly the same with God. We can't have a close relationship with God without spending time talking with Him. Yet, in this relationship we don't talk as peers. He is Creator, and we are creatures. He is the great Lord, and we are His grateful

servants. Because of His amazing love and extravagant grace, He invites us to interact. He has opened His mouth and spoken to us. Now He opens His ear to hear us.

It is very easy to make people feel guilty about failure in the prayer and that's not my intent this morning. However, we must come to grips with the fact that to be like Jesus we must pray.
