WE APPROACH THE LORD

Prelude Call toWorship

We will again look to a psalm, Psalm 30, for a uniting thematic thread for our service today. Notice, if you read the entire psalm, the element of trials and the reward of faith in the ever-reliable God.

Psalm 30 ESV

Leader:

- I will extol you, O LORD, for you have drawn me up and have not let my foes rejoice over me.
- ² O LORD my God, I cried to you for help, and you have healed me.
- ³ O LORD, you have brought up my soul from Sheol; you restored me to life from among those who go down to the pit.

- For his anger is but for a moment,
 and his favor is for a lifetime.

We here confess the fact that our trust in our own minds and perceived insight is greater than our trust in God's revealed Word.

Corporate Confession

Almighty Father, Who by your will and for your glory formed us and everything else in all creation, Who upholds all things by the power of your Word, and Who has graciously and lovingly preserved your people and provided for our needs, we confess our constant failure to trust You and rely upon your goodness. Instead of leaning wholly upon You, we have thought and acted upon the meager understanding afforded by our limited human perspectives. Rather than acknowledging You in all our ways, we have forgotten You and turned to our own way, the way that seems right unto a man, but leads to death. We have sinned against You constantly by presuming to own ourselves and our ways, in violation of your holy command to trust You with all of our hearts. With renewed faith we cast ourselves upon Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith, Who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness. In abject sorrow we confess our unbelief, and in heartfelt and sincere repentance ask You for the grace of faith, wrought by your Holy Spirit, which You have promised to give your people Israel. Write your law on our hearts, that we may adopt your heart and mind, and evermore walk in the light, as You are in the light, through Jesus Christ, the Light of the world. Amen.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

- 12 Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
