The sins forbidden in the third commandment are, the not using of God's name as is required; and the abuse of it in an ignorant, vain, irreverent, profane, superstitious or wicked mentioning or otherwise using his titles, attributes, ordinances [Psalm 50:16-17] or works by blasphemy, perjury...**WLC Q. 142.** What are the sins forbidden in the eighth commandment? A... receiving any thing that is stolen [Psalm 50:18]...**WLC Q. 145.** What are the sins forbidden in the ninth commandment?
