## My Times are in Your Hand Psalm 31

Christ's Concerto: God is faithful to deliver the one who trusts in Him

**Introduction:** Psalm 31 – a Concerto in three parts

The most quoted verse of Psalm 31

First movement – the exposition (1-8): From a refuge to a broad place

Verses 1-4: Refuge, Rock, Fortress

The basis of the Psalmist's plea

Verse 5 (bridge): The Psalmist commits his spirit to God

A call for you to do the same

Verses 6-8: Delivered to a broad place

Second movement – the development (9-18): From sorrow to trust

Verses 9-13: Distress, sorrow, grief, sighing, reproached, forgotten

**Verses 14-18:** But ... my times are in your hand

A call to know the times (and your time)

Third movement – the recapitulation and coda: From goodness to praise

**Verses 19-22 (solo):** The Psalmist praises God

Verses 23-24 (orchestral coda): The entire orchestra praises God

**Coda** – Christ's concerto
