## LARGER CATECHISM Q. 87 WHAT ARE WE TO BELIEVE CONCERNING THE RESURRECTION?

**A.** We are to believe, that at the last day there shall be a general resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust: when they that are then found alive shall in a moment be changed; and the self-same bodies of the dead which were laid in the grave, being then again united to their souls for ever, shall be raised up by the power of Christ. The bodies of the just, by the Spirit of Christ, and by virtue of his resurrection as their head, shall be raised in power, spiritual, incorruptible, and made like to his glorious body; and the bodies of the wicked shall be raised up in dishonour by him, as an offended judge.

# LARGER CATECHISM Q. 129. What is required of superiors towards their inferiors?

A. It is required of superiors, according to that power they receive from God, and that relation wherein they stand, to love, pray for, and bless their inferiors; to <u>instruct</u>, <u>counsel</u> and <u>admonish them</u>; <u>countenancing</u>, <u>commending</u>, and <u>rewarding such as do well</u>, and <u>discountenancing</u>, <u>reproving</u>, and <u>chastising such as do ill</u>; protecting, and providing for them all things necessary for soul and body: and by grave, wise, holy, and exemplary carriage, to procure glory to God, honour to themselves, and so to preserve that authority which God hath put upon them.
