# 1 Thessalonians 5:1-4

# Living in the Light of His Return: The Day of the Lord

- **I. The Timing of the Day of the Lord (v.1)** Now as to the times and the epochs, brethren, you have no need of anything to be written to you.
- II. The Suddenness of the Day of the Lord (v.2-3a) For you yourselves know full well that the day of the Lord will come just like a thief in the night. <sup>3</sup> While they are saying, "Peace and safety!"
- **III.** The Destruction of the Day of the Lord (v.3b) then destruction will come upon them suddenly like birth pangs upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape.
- IV. The Preparation for the Day of the Lord (v.4) <sup>4</sup> But you, brethren, are not in darkness, that the day should overtake you like a thief;

## 1. Launching Question(s):

 Have you ever had a conversation with a non-believer about the coming judgment of God? How did the conversation go?

#### 2. Observation Question(s):

• Why is it that non-believers deceive themselves into thinking that they live in "peace and safety" (v.3) and need not concern themselves with God's coming judgments?

### 3. Interpretation Question(s):

- What is the Day of the Lord according to both Old Testament (Amos 5:18-20; Ezek. 30:3) and New Testament sources (Matt. 24:37-39; 2 Thess. 1:6-10; 2 Peter 3:10)?
- What are two illustrations of the suddenness and eventuality of the coming of the Day of the Lord found in this passage?
- Paul's emphasis seems to be informing the Thessalonians of the coming Day of the Lord so that they will be ready for it. How does a Christian faithfully prepare themselves for the coming of the Day of the Lord?

#### 4. Reflection Question(s):

- How might Paul's explanation of the Day of the Lord have served to encourage the persecuted Thessalonian Christians?
- How does an understanding of the Day of the Lord serve to encourage you in the midst of your difficulties?

### 5. Application Question(s):

• How might focusing on the coming Day of the Lord make your life different this week?
