Prelude Call to Worship

This call to worship highlights the worthiness of God to receive our praise, the folly of not fearing Him, and the blessedness of doing so.

Psalm 115:1-13 ESV

- Not to us, O LORD, not to us, but to your name give glory, for the sake of your steadfast love and your faithfulness!
- ² Why should the nations say,

"Where is their God?"

- ³ Our God is in the heavens; he does all that he pleases.

The role of God's people with respect to unbelievers, throughout redemptive history, has never been to pronounce condemnation, which is solely God's right, but rather both to embody and to proclaim the character of the God of grace, who demonstrates His kindness constantly to all He has made (cf. Il Corinthians 5:18-20).

2 Kings 6:18–23 ESV

¹⁸ And when the Syrians came down against him, Elisha prayed to the LORD and said, "Please strike this people with blindness." So he struck them with blindness in accordance with the prayer of Elisha. ¹⁹ And Elisha said to them, "This is not the way, and this is not the city. Follow me, and I will bring you to the man whom you seek." And he led them to Samaria.

²⁰ As soon as they entered Samaria, Elisha said, "O LORD, open the eyes of these men, that they may see." So the LORD opened their eyes and they saw, and behold, they were in the midst of Samaria.

²¹ As soon as the king of Israel saw them, he said to Elisha, "My

father, shall I strike them down? Shall I strike them down?" ²² He answered, "You shall not strike them down. Would you strike down those whom you have taken captive with your sword and with your bow? Set bread and water before them, that they may eat and drink and go to their master." ²³ So he prepared for them a great feast, and when they had eaten and drunk, he sent them away, and they went to their master. And the Syrians did not come again on raids into the land of Israel.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

We see here an affirmation of the gospel as the rationale for the calling of believers toward unbelievers: that we proclaim the message of reconciliation.

2 Corinthians 5:21 ESV

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Having seen the transcendent love and grace of God in Christ for sinners, we celebrate the implications for us who realize our sin as well, who have availed ourselves through faith of that grace.

Prayers of Intercession

The Apostles' Creed

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
