Sermon Text: Romans 4:1-12 Divine Reckoning of Grace

God's reckoning of righteousness is a gift received only by faith.

- 1) In God's reckoning Abraham receives righteousness by faith.
 - a) Jewish traditions of Abraham's faithfulness/obedience
 - b) Not even Abraham can receive righteousness as wages for his work.
 - c) Even Abraham must receive righteousness as a gift from God's grace. (Genesis 15:6)
 - i) God is Abraham's shield and reward (Genesis 15:1-2)
 - ii) God cut a covenant with Abraham unilaterally (Genesis 15:9-21)
- 2) In God's reckoning David receives righteousness by forgiveness.
 - a) Not even David can receive righteousness as wages for his work.
 - b) Even David must receive righteousness as a gift from God's grace.
 - c) Blessedness of righteousness (Psalm 32:1-2)
 - d) Blessedness of forgiveness
- 3) In God's reckoning you are blessed with righteousness by grace through faith.
 - a) Abraham was declared righteous before he was given the sign of circumcision to show that Gentiles can be justified by having the same faith as Abraham.
 - b) God's Covenant Seal of the Gift of Righteousness--circumcision
 - c) Father Abraham—Jews and Gentiles one people justified by grace through faith in Christ
 - d) Application:
 - i) Salvation by Grace Alone
 - (1) For the Glory of God's Grace
 - (2) For the Humility of Believers
 - ii) Justification by Faith Alone
 - (1) For the Glory of Christ's Work
 - (2) For the Assurance of Peace with God
 - iii) Scripture Alone as Final Authority
 - (1) For Faith and Practice
 - (2) For Polemics and Apologetics: Contending for the Faith
 - (3) For Missions and Evangelism
