Daniel 8:1-27

I. Expect man's kingdom to war against	itself (vv.	3-8, 20-22	2).
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II. Expect man's kingdom to war against Israel (vv. 9-14, 23-25).

QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

- 1. What do you think of the maxim, "Hope for the best, prepare for the worst"? Is this a Christian way of speaking? If so, how does the Christian understand it differently than the world?
- 2. What is the relation of the vision in Daniel 8 to the vision in Daniel 7?
- 3. What do the two beasts in Daniel 8 symbolize? Which one defeats the other, and how was this fulfilled in history?
- 4. Why does the rise and fall of kings and kingdoms make it difficult for God's people to get comfortable in this world? Why is that actually a good thing for God's people?
- 5. Who is the little horn in Daniel 8, and how is he related to the little horn in Daniel 7?
- 6. Read 1 John 2:18. How does this help us to understand what Daniel is seeing here, and its relation to us and what we should expect in the future?
- 7. If the Scriptures teach that the worst is yet to come, why is it wrong to call Christianity pessimistic?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

- 1. Could I describe in a few brief sentences how Daniel's vision in chapter 8 fits into his vision in chapter 7? Why is it important to understand this?
- 2. How does the vision in Daniel 8 encourage me to think about the wars and rumors of wars that are a present, inescapable reality?
- 3. How is hoping for the best actually the best way to prepare for the worst?
