Pray that believers (specifically, our church) will be devoted to prayer.

**Context:** In this section, the Apostle Paul wraps up his letter to the Colossians by giving some commands about prayer and mission and sending final greetings to the church.

**How to pray for believers and our church:**

1. Pray that our lives and church will be marked by \_\_\_\_\_ (2).
2. Pray that God will open doors for the Gospel message and that we will make the most of every opportunity in \_\_\_\_\_ (3-6).
3. Pray that we will \_\_\_\_\_ for each other to mature and be firmly established in God's will (12).
