Chapter 15 Of Repentance unto Life

1. Repentance unto life is an evangelical grace, the doctrine whereof is to be preached by every minister of the gospel, as well as that of faith in Christ.

Or despisest thou the riches of His goodness and forbearance and longsuffering, not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance?

repent (Oxford English Dictionary),

To **review** one's actions and feel **contrition** or **regret** for something one has **done** or **omitted** to do; (esp. in religious contexts) to acknowledge the **sinfulness** of one's past action or conduct by showing sincere **remorse** and undertaking to **reform** in the future.

Berkhof (Manual of Christian Doctrine)

The conversion we have in mind here may be defined as that act of God whereby He causes the regenerated, in their conscious life, to turn to Him in faith and repentance.

Repentance, the Negative Element of Conversion:

Repentance looks to the past, and may be defined as that change wrought in the conscious life of the sinner by which he turns away from sin. It includes three elements, namely, (a) an <u>intellectual element</u>, in which the past life is viewed as a life of sin, involving personal guilt, defilement, and <u>helplessness</u>; (b) an <u>emotional element</u>, a sense of sorrow for sin as committed against a holy and just God; and (c) an <u>element of the will</u>, consisting in a change of purpose, an inward turning from sin and a disposition to seek pardon and cleansing.

Saving faith, the Positive Element of Conversion:

saving faith...This has its seat in the heart and is rooted in the regenerated life. Its seed is implanted in regeneration and gradually blossoms into an active faith. It may be defined as a positive conation [volition], wrought in the heart by the Holy Spirit, as to the truth of the gospel, and a hearty reliance on the promises of God in Christ.

Confessio (Augustine)

"...speech offered to God in dual acknowledgement of its **speaker's insufficiency** as speaker, and **God's all sufficiency** as giver of all speech, the one in whom as *logos* all human speech participates..."

Acts 11:18

(ESV)

18 When they heard these things they fell silent. And they glorified God, saying, "Then to the Gentiles also God has granted repentance that leads to life."

Luke 24:47 (KJV)

And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.

And saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: **repent ye, and believe the gospel.**

Westminster Confession Chapter 15
2. By it [i.e., Repentance unto Life] a sinner, out of the sight and sense, not only of the danger, but also of the filthiness and odiousness of his sins, as contrary to the holy nature and righteous law of God, and upon the apprehension of his mercy in Christ to such as are penitent, so grieves for and hates his sins as to turn from them all unto God, purposing and endeavoring to walk with him in all the ways of his commandments.

SCAN'DAL, *noun* [Latin scandalum; Gr. In Greek, this word signifies a stumbling block, something against which a person impinges, or which causes him to fall.]. **Offense given by the faults of another.**

1 Timothy 1:15-16 (ESV)
