After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could number, of all nations, tribes, peoples, and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" Steven Ray Hammond was born May 17th, 1962, in Houston, Texas. He was the first child of Raymond Truett Hammond and Wanda Joyce (Solomon) Cain. Steven graduated from Saltillo High School in Saltillo, Texas in 1980 and received a Bachelor of Science from East Texas State University in Commerce, Texas in 1983. He also received his Master of Divinity from Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary in Mill Valley, California, in 2001. Steven began his first full-time pastorate at Springfield Baptist Chapel in Springfield, Colorado in 1994, then moved to Estes Park, Colorado, in 1997 with his family to pastor Estes Park Baptist Church. In 2002, he took a sabbatical and moved to Cleburne, Texas, where he became the IT Manager at Technical Chemical Company and remained there until his passing.

In 1982, Steven met Michelle Ann Tomb on a blind date. They were married July 1st, 1983. Eventually they had three children: Stephanie Rae (Hammond) Florentino was born on her dad's birthday on May 17th, 1987. Andrea Gail Hammond was born on Steven's dad's birthday on October 21st, 1993, and Christina Marie Hammond chose her own birthday on October 2nd, 1994. Steven was also considered a second father to many. Last year, Steven and Michelle celebrated their 38th wedding anniversary. Steven leaves behind not only a wife and three daughters, but also his mother Wanda, his brother Ron and sister Cynthia, his step-sister Rhonda and step-brother Kenneth, as well as many other relatives.

Steven was very passionate about his family, his church and amateur radio. He was a member at Heritage Baptist Church in Mansfield, Texas for the past twenty years and was also a member of the Johnson County Amateur Radio Club with the call sign KY5M and is now Silent Key. He was well-known for his unique sense of humor, his love for God and his family, and his dedication to studying the Bible. Above all, his greatest desire was the sharing of the Gospel and for others to know the Lord.

On the evening of February 1st, 2022, Steven passed from this life surrounded by family and one of his pastors. His family and friends are grateful for the honor of having him in their lives, and rejoice in the fact that he has ascended into glory and is now in the presence of his Lord.
