Scripture Reading

Revelation 1:1-3 (NASB)

1 The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show to His bond-servants, the things which must soon take place; and He sent and communicated it by His angel to His bond-servant John, 2 who testified to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw. 3 Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of the prophecy, and heed the things which are written in it; for the time is near.

We covered this in depth the past couple of studies

- ス Jesus knew the end times events concerning His return (evident by the Olivet Discourse); but at that time Jesus did not know the actual day/hour concerning His return determined by His Father
- A However, when we get to the visions in Revelation, the Father fully disclosed all of the details concerning Jesus's return, so Jesus now knows the day/hour associated with the end time events whereas back in Mt 24 He didn't because His time has not yet come (Jesus wasn't exalted nor entered His glory yet)

2 who testified to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw.

"testified" is 'martureō' which means to bear witness to testify
We get our English word 'martyr" from this Greek word
Stephen is the first "martyr" to die for bearing witness to Jesus!
The angel bore witness and delivered the vision to John
John in turn is bearing witness and wrote the vision down
So the book of Revelation is John's testimony on behalf of Jesus!
The gospel of John is also a testimony on behalf of Jesus!

John 21:24 (at the close of his gospel, referring to himself in the 3rd person) 24 This is the disciple who is testifying (martureō) to these things and wrote these things, and we know that his (John's) testimony is true. AJohn's testimony is true because he was chosen by Jesus to be an apostle AThus as an apostle, the gospel of John can be trusted And so is the book of Revelation to be trusted! For the source is from

In other words the Bible, including Revelation, is from HEAVEN!



In verse 2, I'd like to call out:

スJohn wrote the vision of Revelation exactly how it was given to him!
スJohn wrote what he was commanded to write!
スJohn did not write was he was commanded not to write!
スAllow me to show you...

1:11 – "write in a book what you see" 1:19 – "write the things which you have seen" 2:1 – "to the angel of the church in Ephesus write" 2:8 – "to the angel of the church in Smyrna write" 2:12 – "to the angel of the church in Pergamum write" 2:18 – "to the angel of the church in Thyatira write" 3:1 – "to the angel of the church in Sardis write" 3:7 – "to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write" 3:14 – "to the angel of the church of Laodicea write"

10:4 - "I was about to write, and I heard a voice from heaving saying, "Seal up the things which the seven peals of thunder have spoken and <u>do not write</u> them"

14:13 – "And I heard a voice from heaven, saying, "<u>Write</u>, Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on!"

19:9 – "Then he said to me, <u>Write</u>, Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb."

21:5 – And He who sits on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." And He said, "<u>Write</u>, for these words faithful and true."

So all throughout this letter John wrote was he was commanded to write
John wrote the vision exactly as it was given him
In the sequence and order it was given him
And if he was commanded not to write, he didn't write it

So we're going to do the exactly that for our Revelation study!...

Re're going to read it the way John was given it! Re're going to receive it the way John received it! Reverse we want to deviate from any of the visions! Interpret the visions using Scripture Re're not going to reorder, reorganize the visions ^{C3} Unless of course there is a clear time marker given by Scripture • We're going to treat them as "marching orders" \bowtie From the Father \rightarrow Christ \rightarrow to the church (us)! Re're not going to add (write into) Scripture what it did not write! Revelation or other Scripture to support a view we hold!

☑ In other words, the application from v. 2 is:

• We're going to bear the same witness and testimony as John!

Since the source of Revelation and the rest of Scripture is from HEAVEN, it's words are faithful and true and worthy to be trusted and believed!

Ret's study it the way it was given and not mess with it and see where it takes us!

3 Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of the prophecy, and heed the things which are written in it; for the time is near. "Blessed" is 'makarios' which means happy

Revelation 22:7 (Jesus speaking) "And behold, I am coming quickly. Blessed [makarios; happy] is he who heeds the words of the prophecy of this book."

- Revelation is the only book with a promised blessing in the beginning/end! Revelation is the promised blessing tied to?
- ෬ So to answer that question, we're going to look to the rest of Scripture෬ So lets survey the entire Bible beginning in Genesis...
- Revelation But rather we'll focus on covenantal blessings with promise tied to Revelation

Genesis 12:1-3

1 Now the LORD said to Abram,

"Go forth from your country,

And from your relatives

And from your father's house,

To the land which I will show you;

2 And I will make you a great nation,

And I will bless you,

And make your name great;

And so **you shall be a blessing**;

3 And I will bless those who bless you,

And the one who curses you I will curse.

And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."

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TRUTH: The promised blessing in Revelation has its foundation in the Abrahamic Covenant! Which means the promised blessing is tied to the holy land and people of Israel!

⁶ Pray for the peace of Jerusalem:
"May they prosper who love you.
⁷ "May peace be within your walls, And prosperity within your palaces."
Psalms 122:6-7

CR The blessing followed Abraham → Isaac → Jacob (stole the blessing from Esau)
CR Romans 9 gives us great insight into this
CR From Jacob (renamed Israel) → 12 Sons (12 Tribes) → 1 of those sons was Judah
CR As Israel was at the end of life, he passed the blessing to Judah:
CR Genesis 49:10 "The scepter shall not depart from Judah,
Nor the ruler's staff from between his feet,
Until Shiloh [Messiah] comes,
And to him [Messiah] shall be the obedience of the peoples.

বে So when Israel past away, the blessing followed Judah!

R Where did it go from there?

মে King David!

Matthew 1:1-6 (Geneology)

1 The record of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, <u>the son of David, the son of</u> <u>Abraham</u>:

2 Abraham was the father of Isaac, Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers. 3 Judah was the father of Perez and Zerah by Tamar, Perez was the father of Hezron, and Hezron the father of Ram. 4 Ram was the father of Amminadab, Amminadab the father of Nahshon, and Nahshon the father of Salmon. 5 Salmon was the father of Boaz by Rahab, Boaz was the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse. 6 Jesse was the father <u>of David the king</u>.

ম So after Judah the blessing followed King David!

And that blessing was re-affirmed through the Davidic Covenant!

2 Samuel 7:11-17 (God made a covenant with David)

The LORD also declares to you [David] that the LORD will make a house for you. 12 When your days are complete and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your descendant after you, who will come forth from you, and I will establish his kingdom. 13 He shall build a house for My name, and <u>I will establish the throne of his kingdom</u> <u>forever</u>. 14 I will be a father to him and he will be a son to Me; when he commits iniquity, I will correct him with the rod of men and the strokes of the sons of men, 15 but My lovingkindness shall not depart from him, as I took it away from Saul, whom I removed from before you. 16 <u>Your house and your kingdom shall endure before Me</u> <u>forever; your throne shall be established forever</u>."" 17 In accordance with all these words and all this vision, so Nathan spoke to David.

Real But what about the Mosaic Covenant?

Came in between Abrahamic and Davidic Covenant?

IMPORTANT NOTE: The Abrahamic Covenant and David Covenant only came with a promised blessing – no cursing (for disobedience)!

₩ Whereas, the Mosaic Covenant came with both a blessing and curse (for disobedience)...

Deuteronomy 11:26-28

26 "See, I am setting before you today <u>a blessing and a curse</u>: 27 <u>the blessing</u>, if you listen to the commandments of the LORD your God, which I am commanding you today; 28 <u>and the curse</u>, if you do not listen to the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside from the way which I am commanding you today, by following other gods which you have not known.

As we learned in our Daniel series, because of their disobedience they did not receive blessing but a curse

🛯 i.e. Assyrian/Babylonian captivity

₩E GOT TO GET THIS: The promised blessing did NOT follow the Mosaic Law!
This is what Paul taught time and time again...

Romans 3:19-20

- 19 Now we know that whatever the Law says, it speaks to those who are under the Law, so that every mouth may be closed and all the world may become accountable to God; 20 because **by the works of the Law no flesh will be justified** in His sight; for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin.
- ෬ The promised blessing in the Abrahamic Covenant did NOT pass to the Torah!
- The blessing in the Torah was concerning the covenant the people of Israel agreed to enter into with their God; and if they obeyed, they'd be blessed; if they disobeyed, they'd be cursed
- The purpose of the Law was NOT to give blessing (justification) but be a guardian
 In fact, Paul too made the distinction with the blessing promised to Abraham vs. the Law...

Galatians 3:23-29 (context is the intent of the Law)

23 But before faith came, we (the Jews) were kept in custody under the law, being shut up to the faith which was later to be revealed. 24 Therefore the Law has become our tutor (paidagogos; children teacher/instructor) to lead us to Christ, so that we may be justified by faith. 25 But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor. 26 For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. 27 For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. 28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus. 29 And if you belong to Christ, **then you are Abraham's descendants**, heirs according **to promise**.

Real POINT BEING: Believers are children of God not because of our obedience to the Law, but through faith in Jesus Christ!

CASE IN POINT: The promised blessing in the Abrahamic Covenant did not transfer to the Mosaic Law

CR The blessing followed the Abrahamic Covenant → David Covenant
CR The blessing followed Abraham → Isaac → Jacob → Judah → David
CR And that blessing was re-affirmed through the Davidic Covenant!
CR Thus, the blessing followed Abrahamic Covenant → Davidic Covenant
CR Not the Mosaic Covenant

R There is no promised blessing (salvation) in the Mosaic Covenant!

In fact, Jesus instituted a New Covenant during the Last Supper!

Real Where did the promised blessing follow after David?

ম্থে You guessed it.... To JESUS CHRIST!

Real How do we know that?

Real Follow the genealogies in Mt 1 and Lk 3

C3 Yes the boring part of Scripture!

R If you follow the genealogies, the promised blessing went from:

 $\texttt{CS} \text{Abraham} \rightarrow \text{Isaac} \rightarrow \text{Jacob} \rightarrow \text{Judah} \rightarrow \text{David} \rightarrow \text{Jesus!}$

Which means, the promised blessing is in the 1st and 2nd Coming of Jesus Christ!
 We are blessed (happy) when we reflect on Jesus's 1st coming and look forward in FAITH to His glorious return to earth!

Anything else this blessing is tied to?... Luke tells us...

Luke 11:27-28 (Jesus casted out a demon; crowd alleged it was by Beelzebul) 27 While Jesus was saying these things, one of the women in the crowd raised her voice and said to Him, "Blessed is the womb that bore You and the breasts at which You nursed." 28 But He said, "On the contrary, <u>blessed</u> (makarios; happy) are those who hear the word of God and observe it."

The blessing is connected to hearing the Word and observing it (phulasso, which means to guard, watch over)

C3 The Bible is the promised blessing and the blessings (our happiness) comes to fruition when we study, guard, protect and BELIEVE what it says!

When we believe and accept Jesus 1st and 2nd comings!
