Living Worthy of My Calling, Pt. 16 "Be Filled with the Spirit"

Ephesians 5:18

To live in a manner worthy of my calling, the old life with its fleshly excesses and waste is to be put off, and a new life of power in the Spirit is to be enjoyed.

1. A Life No longer Wasted A Great Contrast!

"And do not be drunk with wine,
"drunk" Wycliffe transl: "filled with wine"
"dissipation" ="excess," "wastefulness"
"riotous living"

in which is dissipation, but be filled with the Spirit."

cf. the prodigal son Lk. 15:13
"he squandered his estate with loose living" NASV

The Apostle wishes to contrast the life these believers knew in the past with their new life in Christ

(1) A controlled and ordered life vs. a life in which one has lost control

- the life of the drunkard: loss of direction, motivation; there is increased disorder, chaos
- contrast: the fruit of the Spirit: self-control an ordered life

(2) A life in which the noblest elements are elevated & strengthened vs. a life in which base desires are elevated and noble elements dulled

- alcohol is not a stimulant it is a depressant
- the one who is drunk has his senses dulled cf. Prov. 23:29-33

(3) A productive life vs. a life of wastefulness

(4) An energized life vs. a life that is sapped of its vitality, exhausted

- various ways in which those of the world seek to stimulate themselves, but such "stimulants" only leave the life exhausted
- the Holy Spirit does not exhaust us! He gives power and life!

2. A Life of Superior Delights

- Enjoyment of food and wine is presented in the Scriptures as a figure of the blessedness of the soul which finds delight in God cf. Prov. 9:1ff
- The Apostle intends at least *some similarity* between intoxication with wine and the condition of being filled with the Spirit
- cf. Pentecost "they are full of sweet wine!"

(1) The Christian life is not merely a "collection of negatives"

- not a mere negative morality!
- a full and beautiful life!

(2) The Christian life is an exhilarating, stimulating life (it is real life!)

- The Spirit of God stimulates in the highest sense of the term
- He stimulates the mind, the intellect (historically, very clearly demonstrated)
- He stimulates the heart, the emotions

(3) The Christian life is a life which is happy, blessed, full

- cf. v.19 "singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord"

(4) The Christian life is a life of true and deep shared delight in relationships - conviviality

cf. v.19 "speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs"
 v. 20 "submitting to one another in the fear of God"
