

Who Sees and Who Can't

Eye Opening Revelation

Join me in Genesis and Proverbs for light on the light and life of walking in the joy of His justice and judgment.

"Evil men do not understand justice, but those who seek the Lord understand all" (Proverbs 28:5).

You cannot remain evil... something must happen to your heart to change who, what, why, when, and how you see.

As I've shared with you... people, humanity without Jesus, are troubled and headed for more trouble than they can afford. Man is not good. I'll repeat that, man is not good when man is left to himself. Why? Man cannot remedy his nature. Humanity cannot fix itself.

The Lord says that He committed that he would not curse the ground and all living creatures as he has done in the flood, even though the heart of men is desperately wicked or evil from his youth. Because judgment, even the most severe judgment, does not fix the heart of men. There's only one judgment that fixes the heart of men, that transforms the heart of men, and that's the just life and the just judgment of Jesus, on behalf of sinners who place their trust and their lives into His hands. But you can put a fool in a millstone and grind him up to pieces and you won't change his foolishness, the essence of his nature and folly. Just like the wicked, when they die, the hypocrite (ungodly), when he dies, and his hopes come to nothing, and he has nothing to give unto the Lord (Job 27:8), even in that eternal judgment, his folly is not fixed. He'll have to bear his nature and folly for an eternity. Because even in judgment, it doesn't transform the fool. There's only one judgment that transforms the fool, and that is the judgment placed upon Jesus. So the catastrophic flood that judged the world and everybody that died didn't fix the problem with man's heart. Only one person can fix the issue of man's heart and therefore he takes dead men and makes them alive. He removes the heart of deadness and gives them a heart that is alive unto God's voice and vision. He took Noah, who was dead, as all sinners are, and graced him — He bestowed grace on Him and made him alive to God.

And as we said, we see how the flood of waters of Noah did not fix the evil hearts of mankind... and the final judgment will not fix the evil hearts of mankind, either. Only Jesus — the gracious life He lived, the gracious judgment He faced, the gracious blood He shed, graciously in the place of sinners like me, can make an individual, like me and you, a righteous and new creation. Only Jesus can justify the unjust, because even their judgment, apart from His grace, cannot fix, suffice, or

redeem them.

Now, as you ponder that word, whatever you do, don't miss the drastic contrast between those who seek the Lord (as a way of life) and those who don't seek Him (as a way of life). And those who don't characteristically seek Jesus, as a way of life, are described as evil.

The word EVIL means BAD; and bad because they are BROKEN: and broken because they are FALLEN: and fallen because they are not in the original condition, posture, or position they were created for. Something irreversible happened to the nature and condition of humanity when sin was passed to the children of Adam. Men can't fix this problem. Only God can transform the hearts of people. The evidence of their malignant issue and evil condition is manifested when they live for everything but the Lord and see little to no need to seek the Lord in everything in life. And the contrast of those who have been transformed and made right with Jesus will be manifested in how they have given themselves to Jesus and for the rest of their lives they will characteristically seek the Lord, in everything, and live sharing what they know and understand about Him.

I encourage you, do not miss the contrast of Proverbs 28:5 and the difference between those who seek and those who don't.
