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## **“Adoption” in the New Testament**

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**It's often overlooked**



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**See Eph. 1:3-5**

**See Gal. 4:4-5**

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**e.g. Julius Caesar & Octavian**

**e.g. Vespasian & Josephus**

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## **“Adoption” in Paul’s Setting**

**Paul speaks of adoption in the sense of a minor child coming of age and enjoying the privilege of sonship.**

**It was practiced by the Jews**

**It was practiced by the Greeks**

**It was practiced by the Romans**

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## **“Adoption” in Paul’s Setting**

**This is precisely the idea in Gal. 4**

**Redemption isn’t so much freedom from sin as from elemental things**

**Whether Jews under the Law or Gentiles under paganism, both were captive to an “elemental” system**

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**Note that we are marked out as God’s children by election**

**Yet only through faith in Christ do we receive this “adoption”, having been freed from elemental things**

**Note the “objective” side of adoption, received through union with Christ**
