Exclusive Rights

Colorful depictions of rainbows adorn everything from kids' cereal boxes filled with inedible marshmallow moons, stars and little green clovers and little pony toys to signs and flags of a proud community of gender challenged individuals. It has been used to poetically symbolize the elusive dream of material wealth (as in a pot of gold) or of inner satisfaction (as in "somewhere over" it "the dreams that you dare to dream, really do come true.") Countless lesser entities have adopted the beautiful multicolor image, but the real phenomena that adorns the sky on occasion belongs exclusively to God, and He alone holds exclusive rights to the meaning of it. As Christians we must not lose sight of the glorious significance of this spectacular reminder designed by God Himself, not only for what it means to us, but for what is means for the entire creation that benefits from His ongoing kindness. When you see a rainbow (especially with the naked eye) stop and pause to take in, not only the luxurious beauty of full spectrum of vivid colors, but be taken in by the faithfulness of God that the rainbow itself represents and give Him thanks for His goodness to you, His people, the evil and the good, every living creature and even the very earth itself.
