## "The Spiritual Condition of King Saul" Pastor Edd Cathey February 17, 2019

We are going to pause today from our exploration of the narrative to reflect theologically. In particular, we will consider the spiritual condition of Saul.

Various responses:

1. Saul was a saved man who lost his salvation (vs. 9-12)

2. Saul was a saved man-- with a changed heart and the Holy Spirit was upon him, and therefore must have been saved, but that he was a kind of "carnal" (worldly) believer who, though saved, never yielded to the Lord during his life.

Historic Reformed theology gives us another choice:

3. Saul was a full member of the Covenant People (Visible Church in the New Testament) but not a regenerated person—He was never personally saved, though an Israelite, a member of the Covenant, the chosen people.
