

  - a. When Israel lived there they defiled it by doing their own ways instead of the covenant ways He gave them
  - b. Their ways to Him were like a woman in her menstrual impurity
  - c. He poured out His fury on them because of the blood they shed on the land
  - d. He poured out His fury on them because of their idolatry that defiled the land; with this idolatry they had said that His land was actually the property and home of the evil squatters they had let through their borders
  - e. So as He did at Babel, He scattered the people among the nations and on property that was not theirs; it belonged to the nations, not Israel, governed by the principalities under whom God had assigned them
  - f. But even in the foreign lands, these cursed, unwelcome immigrants profaned the name of God because they were deemed unworthy by the LORD to remain in the land He selected personally for them
  - g. His concern now was for His own name!
