Introduction

- To forgive another is one of the hardest things to do in life.
- What does it mean to "forgive"?
 - Forgiveness is always a gift. Cannot be earned.
 - Forgiveness involves sending away an offense
- Three promises of forgiveness
 - Not bring up the matter to them again.
 - Not bring up the matter to others.
 - Not bring up the matter to oneself
- It takes a great, good, gracious person and God to forgive.
- Sin is ultimately against God—Psalm 51:3-5

The God who Forgives!

A. Exalt the GREATNESS of God—Nehemiah 9:4-6

- 1. He alone is God!—Deut. 6:4-5, 13-14
- 2. He is the creator of everything we see.
- 3. He is the Source of Life—Gen. 2:7; Ps. 145:13, 15-16; 104:27-30
- 4. He is worshiped by the heavenly hosts.

B. Recall the GOODNESS of God—Nehemiah 9:7-31

- 1. The Founding of the Nation (vv. 7-25)
 - a. The Beginning with Abraham—vv. 7-8
 - b. The Exodus from Egypt—vv. 9-12
 - c. The Giving of the Law at Sinai—vv. 13-15

(The People's Response to God's Goodness—vv. 16-17a)

- d. The Wilderness Wanderings—vv. 19-21
- e. The Conquest of the Land—vv. 22-25

2. The Foundering of the Nation (vv. 26-31)

- a. The "Bad" Cycle
 - 1) Sin—rebelled against God
 - 2) Servitude—oppressed by others
 - 3) Supplication—cried out to God for help
 - 4) Salvation—God sends a deliverer
 - 5) Safety—Enjoys peace for a time
- b. God demonstrates his "forbearance"
- c. Forgiveness is unlimited; Forbearance is limited.
