Sermon: "Judas" in Matthew 26,27

Judas and his betrayal teach us about "real religion" and the need of true repentance.

We see:

1. Judas was a disciple and very religious, but his real religion was a love of money.
2. Judas pursues his religion while pretending all was "ok" with him.
3. Upon finding bitter disappointment Judas was sorry, but not in true repentance.

The Westminster Confession of Faith

WCF 15.1 Repentance unto life is an evangelical grace,(1) the doctrine whereof is to be preached by every minister of the Gospel, as well as that of faith in Christ.(2)

WCF 15.2 By it, a sinner, out of the sight and sense, not only of the danger, but also of the filthiness and odiousness of his sins, as contrary to the holy nature, and righteous law of God; and upon the apprehension of His mercy in Christ to such as are penitent, so grieves for and hates his sins, as to turn from them all unto God,(1) purposing and endeavoring to walk with Him in all the ways of His commandments.(2)

WCF 15.3 Although repentance be not to be rested in, as any satisfaction for sin, or any cause of the pardon thereof,(1) which is the act of God's free grace in Christ;(2) yet it is of such necessity to all sinners, that none may expect pardon without it.(3)

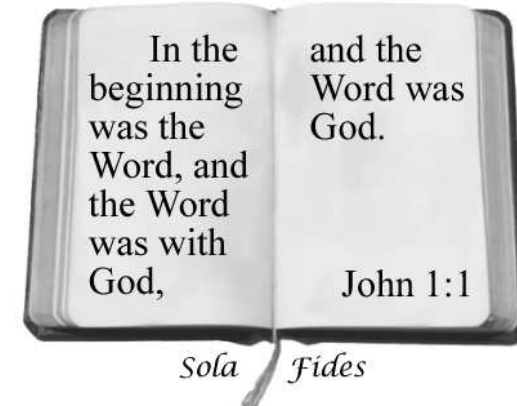
