Overcomers will:

I. Remember - “Remember ye the words... spoken” (vs. 17-21)

It is about Our:

- A. Doctrine** - “building up yourselves...most holy faith”
- B. Desires** - “praying in the Holy Spirit”
- C. Devotion** - “Keep yourselves in the love of God”
- D. Dependence** - “looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus”

II. Rescue - “And of some have compassion ” (vs. 22-23)

It is about those who are:

- A. Doubting** - “making a difference”
- B. Desperate** - “pulling them out of the fire”
- C. Deceived** - “hating even the garment spotted by the flesh”

III. Rely - “Now unto Him who is able” (vs. 24-25)

It is about:

- A. Resilience** - “to keep you from falling”
- B. Righteousness** - “ present you faultless before...His glory”
- C. Rejoicing** - “with exceeding joy”
