The Transforming Power of Christian Freedom Galatians 5:13-15

- 1. Christian freedom is the freedom to do and be what God called us to (13a)
- 2. God did not call us to a fleshly freedom (13b/c)
- 3. God called us to the true expression of Christian freedom: a life of loving service (13d)
 - a. Why did we have to be set free in order to be loving servants?
 - i. We had to be freed from the bondage of our selfish heart and receive a new heart
 - ii. We had to be freed from the need to prove ourselves to God and others
 - iii. We had to learn about true love through Christ's work to set us free
 - iv. We had to see true servanthood in Christ's work to set us free
 - v. We had to be motivated by God's love for us that set us free
 - vi. We had to see our value to God so that we would properly value those whom we are called to serve
 - vii. We had to be empowered for loving service through the reception of the Holy Spirit

- b. What is this love?
 - i. It is love for others
 - ii. It is the motive for the service to others
 - iii. It is the expression of our faith in the gospel
 - iv. It is the love of Christ
 - v. It is miraculous
 - vi. It serves in every way while always pursuing the eternal good of others
 - vii. It is unconditional
 - viii. It is guided by God's Word
 - ix. It is a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God

Ephesians 5:1-2 Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

- 4. This loving service is the principle underlying the entire law (14)
- 5. If they do not understand true Christian freedom, God's children will turn against each other (15).
