### Call to Worship

This passage is part of a great prophecy of the blessing that will come to God's people through the triumph of Christ and the Kingdom established by the New Covenant. It predicts that they will say these words, and we are part of its fulfillment today.

#### Isaiah 12:4-6 ESV

<sup>4b</sup> "Give thanks to the LORD, call upon his name,
make known his deeds among the peoples, proclaim that his name is exalted.
<sup>5</sup> "Sing praises to the LORD, for he has done gloriously; let this be made known in all the earth.
<sup>6</sup> Shout, and sing for joy, O inhabitant of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel."

### \* Reading from the Law

Because God has chosen us and brought us to Himself, delivering us from slavery, we belong to Him and owe Him our ultmate allegiance, and thus to give such to anyone or anything else is unthinkable and unspeakably wicked.

### Exodus 19:3-6; 20:1-3 ESV

<sup>3</sup>The LORD called to him out of the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the people of Israel: <sup>4</sup> 'You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. <sup>5</sup> Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine; 6 and you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.' These are the words that you shall speak to the people of Israel."

<sup>1</sup> And God spoke all these words, saying,

<sup>2</sup> "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

<sup>3</sup> "You shall have no other gods before me.

### Silent Confession of Sin Corporate Confession of Sin

### WE REJOICE IN THE ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

### Assurance of Pardoning Grace

The gospel is in part the story of how the Son of God gave Himself for us in order to purify for Himself a people who are His very own, who are consecrated to Him and eager to be confirmed to His character (i.e., to "do good.").

### Titus 2:11–14 ESV

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, <sup>12</sup> training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, <sup>13</sup> waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of

our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, <sup>14</sup> who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his own possession who are zealous for good works.

Leader: This is the gospel. Congregation: Hallelujah!

### Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
