## Reaching Out With Jesus

Luke 5:12-32 Pastor Phil Winfield February 23, 2014

Luke 5:12-16

- Jesus reached out to touch the person that was **<u>untouchable</u>**.
  - 1. The Leper was **humble**.
  - 2. The Leper was **<u>contrite</u>**.
  - 3. The Leper was **<u>reverent</u>**.
  - 4. The Leper exercised faith.
  - 5. Jesus touched him. (v.13)
  - 6. Jesus <u>cleansed</u> him.
  - 7. Jesus **<u>charged</u>** him to follow the law.

Luke 5:17-26

- Jesus reached out to help the **incapable**. Note the participants.
  - 1. The Religious Pharisees and scribes were standing by, or sitting by.
  - 2. The **incapable** paralytic was in need of help.
  - 3. The four faithful Friends were **<u>active</u>** not passive.
  - 4. Jesus saw the **<u>faith</u>** of the four friends.
- 5. The disciples saw Jesus' compassion for the **helpless sinner**

Luke 5:27-32

- Jesus reached out by associating with the **social outcasts**.
  - 1. Jesus' called the tax collector and the tax collector **followed**.
  - 2. The tax collector called **<u>his friends</u>** to his home to meet Jesus.
  - 3. The Pharisees called the disciples (and Jesus) on the carpet.
  - 4. Jesus called the sinners to **become righteous** and the (self) righteous he called **sinners**. Often religion is not helpful!

What is the main point?

What is Jesus demonstrating with this trilogy of outreach stories?

Fishing for men means we will:

- Reach out with Jesus to the **untouchable** Like Lepers
- Reach out with Jesus to the **incapable** Like the helpless
- Reach out with Jesus to the <u>outcasts</u> like proud religious people, like culturally rejected people and like grossly offensive people.
