- Tragedy of climbing the ladder of success, only to find it leaning against the wrong building.
- What evidence in your life that you are a genuine follower of Jesus?

Live or Dead Branch?

A. A Live Branch—a productive, fruit-bearing Christian

- Identification of "fruit"
 - What is it NOT!
 - b. What is fruit?
 - Christ-like Character—Gal. 5:22-23; 2 Peter 1:5-8
 - Christ-like Conduct

 - Praise and Thanksgiving—Heb. 13:5 Supporting others in love—Phil. 4:17
 - Holy, righteous, God-honoring behavior
- Source of Fruit—being grafted into the "true" vine
 - Israel as God's vine
 - As the channel of God's blessing—Ps. 80:8; Isa. 5
 - Failed to produce good grapes
 - As a result, judgment comes upon the nation
 - Jesus Christ as the "true" vine
 - Fulfills Israel's destiny—Psa. 80:14-18
 - We, as branches, were grafted in—John 15:5; Rom. 11
 - In this present age, the church is the channel of blessing
 - Future age, Israel will once again be the channel for blessing—Zechariah 8:12-13, 7-8; Rom. 11:25; Zech. 14:4-5, 9; 12:10

B. A "Dead" Branch—NO fruit!

- Removed by God the Father, the vine-dresser—John 15:2a
- Identification of the "dead" branches
 - Not apostate Christians who have lost their salvation—John 8:37-39; 10:27-29; 11:25-26
 - Not genuine, fruitless Christians—an impossibility
 - Professing, but not possessing Christians
 - Such will always be present in the church
 - Prime example: Judas Iscariot
 - Warning about false prophets—Matt. 7:15. Known by their fruits.
 - Ultimate fate—John 15:6; Matt. 13:49; 7:21-23
