Acts 15:30-40

³⁰ So when they were sent away, they went down to Antioch; and having gathered the congregation together, they delivered the letter. ³¹ When they had read it, they rejoiced because of its encouragement. ³² Judas and Silas, also being prophets themselves, encouraged and strengthened the brethren with a lengthy message. ³³ After they had spent time *there*, they were sent away from the brethren in peace to those who had sent them out. ³⁴ [But it seemed good to Silas to remain there.] ³⁵ But Paul and Barnabas stayed in Antioch, teaching and preaching with many others also, the word of the Lord.

³⁶ After some days Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us return and visit the brethren in every city in which we proclaimed the word of the Lord, *and see* how they are." ³⁷ Barnabas wanted to take John, called Mark, along with them also. ³⁸ But Paul kept insisting that they should not take him along who had deserted them in Pamphylia and had not gone with them to the work. ³⁹ And there occurred such a sharp disagreement that they separated from one another, and Barnabas took Mark with him and sailed away to Cyprus. ⁴⁰ But Paul chose Silas and left, being committed by the brethren to the grace of the Lord.

PRAY, "Father, make us delight in You so much that we would joyfully listen to You first and gladly do what you bid us do."

Tuesday

READ Acts 15:30-40; First Kings 18-19. DISCUSS, What happens to Elijah following his great victory on Mount Carmel? Why does he want to die? Can you relate? Do you know others who get swallowed by despair? Or anger? Or jealousy? Or? How does faith in Christ's promises for His Church help us? MEDITATE on First Thessalonians 2:11-13. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for loving us and for being so patient with us."

Wednesday

READ Acts 15:30-40; Matthew 15:29-16:12. DISCUSS, What are the disciples upset about on the other side after the feeding of the 4,000? Why is it ridiculous? How are you (we) likewise often ridiculous? How does faith in Christ free us to live according to God's commands? MEDITATE on First Thessalonians 2:11-13. PRAY, "Lord Jesus, forgive us for the many times we just don't get it. Teach us to trust You!"

Thursday

READ Acts 15:30-40; Mark 14:1-72; Colossians 1:15-23. DISCUSS, After all that Peter witnessed how could he deny Jesus? How is Christ going to present us? How are you anticipating that now through your thoughts, words, and actions? MEDITATE on **First Thessalonians 2:11-13**. PRAY, "Jesus, enable us to walk in Your ways."

Friday

READ Acts 15:30-40; First Thessalonians 2:11-13; Matthew 5:21-24. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? MEDITATE on First Thessalonians 2:11-13. PRAY for renewal and revival across our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. Both live-stream & inperson services are available.

READ **Acts 15:40-16:40**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for either the *live-stream or in-person service*. Ask Jesus to help us love our neighbors well.
