GOD'S TWIN GIFTS OF GRACE (2)

I. To believe in Jesus Christ II. To suffer for Jesus Christ

I. Review: God's Gift of grace is faith to believe in Jesus Christ

- A. Did we practice thanking the Author and Finisher for our faith in Jesus Christ?
- B. Did you/are you placing your confidence in Jesus Christ?
 - 1. Saving Faith *places trust or confidence in Jesus as prophet, priest, and King* a. what is needed before we place our confidence in Him?
 - 2. God's call is to consider and receive this great Savior (Isaiah 55)
- II. God's second gift of grace: to suffer for Christ
- A. Obverse Paul's peculiar wording about suffering: given as a favor
 - 1. not true about all suffering we experience: 1 Peter 2:20 vs. 3:14
 - 2. What suffering did Paul refer to here?
 - a. vs. 30: define conflict
 - b. Paul's conflict was because of the Gospel he preached (1:17)
 - compare Acts 26:6-8 & 16-18; 9:15-16
 - c. note that the Philippians also experienced this:
- B. Be prepared:
 - 1. The more faithful to and reflective of Jesus, the more 'conflict'
 2 Tim 3:12 Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.

Living these truths ...

- A. We need to be *converted* in our thinking about sufferings for His sake
 - 1. Believing in Jesus & suffering are twin gifts of God
 - a. review Acts 5:41; 2 Cor. 12:10; Col. 1:24; Matt 5:10-11
 - 2. Why do not we generally think like this?
 - a. because we forget that suffering in a Christlike manner, glorifies God!
 - b. because we forget that suffering in a Christlike manner is evangelism
 - c. because we forget that *all our suffering for Jesus will be rewarded* meditate frequently on Matt. 5:10-12; 19:27-30; Eph. 6:5-8;
 - 2 Tim. 2:12
 - d. because we forget that what we suffer now does not compare to the glory we shall inherit: 2 Cor. 4:17-18
