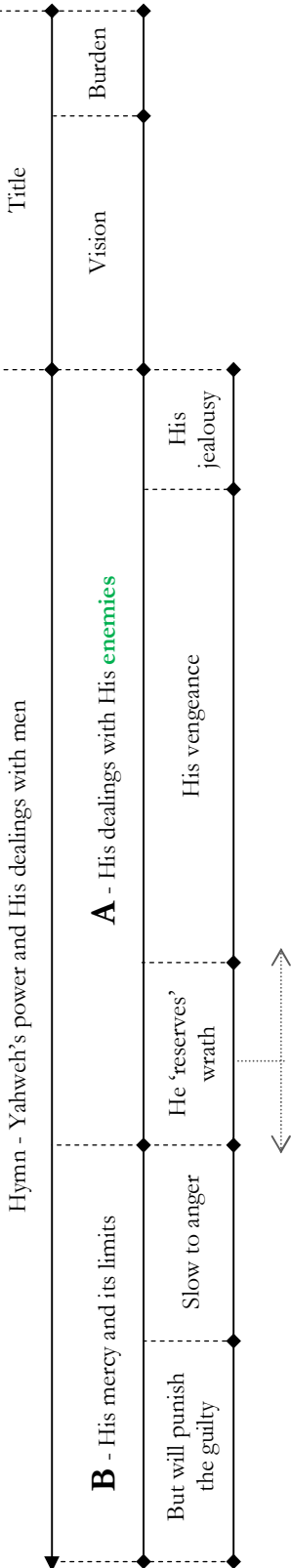


Nahum 1:1-14

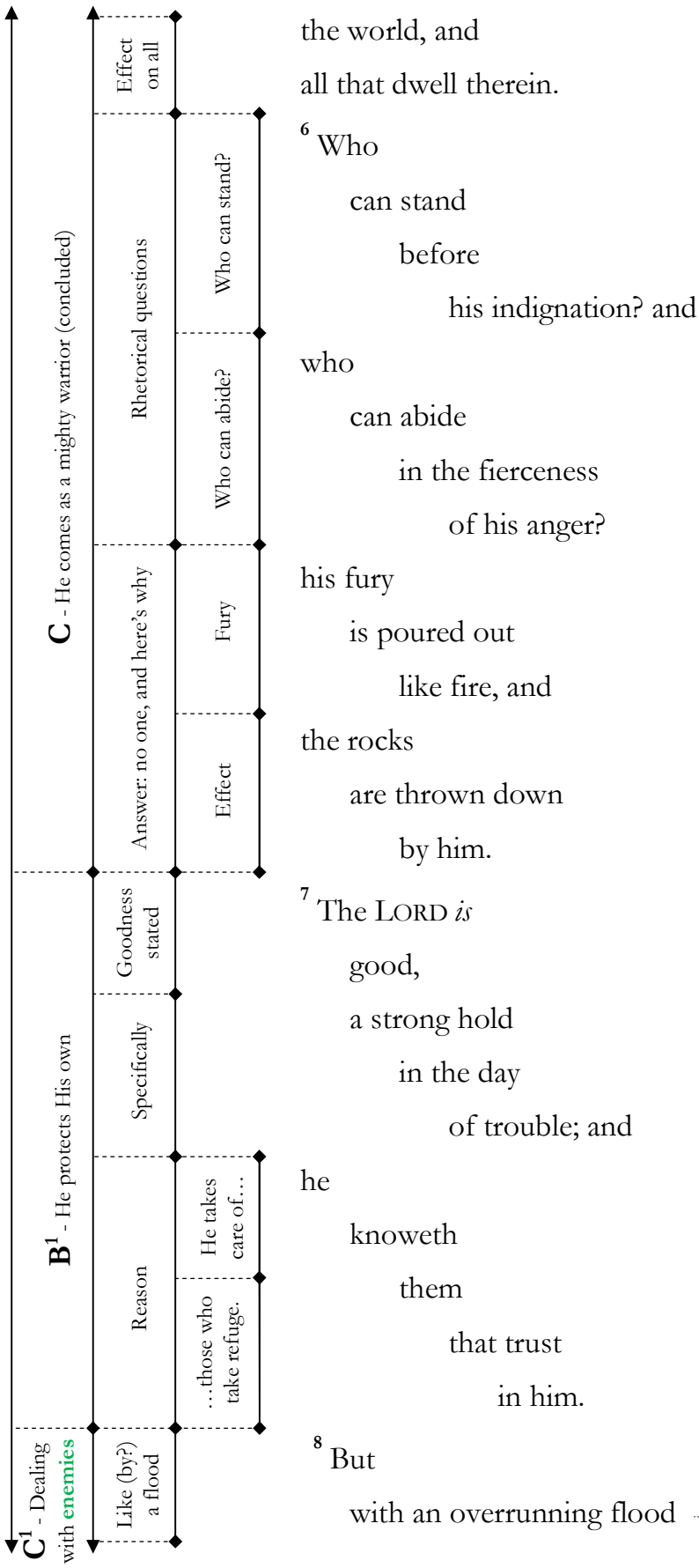

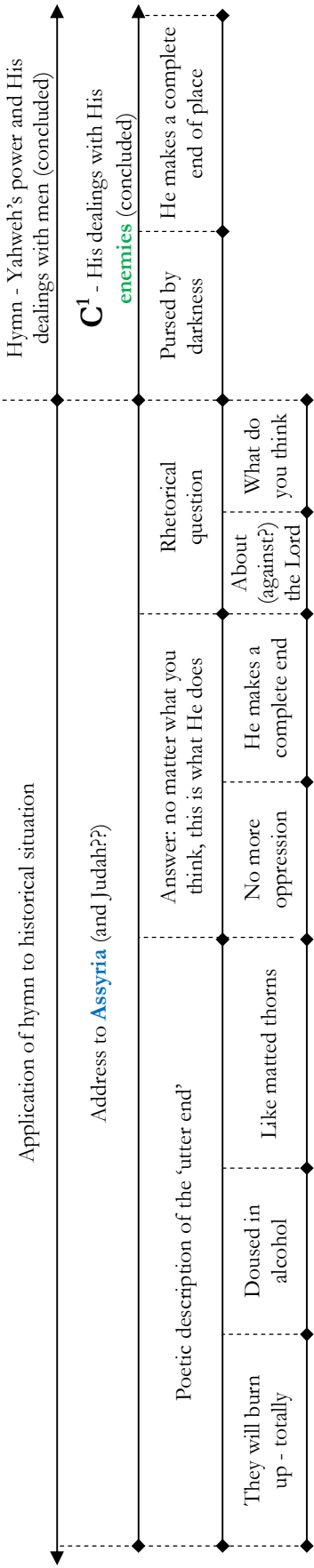
