The Parabolic Setup - v.1-2

Then the kingdom of heaven will be like

ten virgins

who took their *lamps* and went to meet the *bridegroom*.

Five of them were *foolish*, and five were *vise*.

Their Readiness for the Groom - v.3-4

For when the foolish took their lamps, they *took no oil* with them,

but the wise

took flasks of oil with their lamps.

The Delay of the Groom - v.5-6	
As the bridegroom was <i>delayed</i> , they <i>all</i> became drowsy and slept.	
But at midnight there was a cry, 'Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.'	
Going to the Groom - v.7-9 Then all those virgins rose and <i>trimmed</i> their lamps.	
And the <i>foolish</i> said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.'	
But the <i>wise</i> answered, saying, 'Since there will not be enough for us and for you, go rather to the dealers and buy for yourselves.'	
The Bridegroom Arrives - v.10	
And while they were going to buy, the bridegroom <i>came</i> ,	
and those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast,	
and the door was shut.	
The Plea of the Foolish - v.11-12	
Afterward the other virgins came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.'	
But he answered, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.'	

Jesus' Exhortation - v.13	
Watch therefore,	
for you know neither the day nor the hour.	
Conclusions/Applications	
• "The point is simply that readiness, whatever form it takes, is not something that can be achieved by a last-minute adjustment. It depends on long-term provision, and if that has been made, the wise disciple can sleep secure in the knowledge that everything is ready." ~R.T. France
