#1 UNCONTROLLED APPETITES LEAD TO RUIN (Reuben)

Jacob described Reuban as "unstable as water"
 (49:4) which is a Hebrew idiom saying someone has no self-discipline or no self-control.

#1 UNCONTROLLED APPETITES LEAD TO RUIN (Reuben)

Israel's history shows Reuben's consequences

- 1. The tribe of Reuban receives very little mention in the nation's history
- 2. Not a single judge, prophet, military leader, or other important person came out of this tribe.

There are long-term consequences if you fail to deal with the character issues you have in your life.

#2 UNCONTROLLED ANGER LEAD TO RUIN (Simeon & Levi)

"Simeon and Levi are brethren; instruments of cruelty are in their habitations." (49:5)

#2 UNCONTROLLED ANGER LEAD TO RUIN (Simeon & Levi)

Israel's history shows Simeon & Levi's consequences

- 1. Simeon was the smallest tribe in Israel (Num. 26:14)
- 2. When Moses pronounced blessing on Israel, Simeon was committed (Deut. 33:8)
- 3. Both Simeon & Levi were scattered and never had their own land

#2 UNCONTROLLED ANGER LEAD TO RUIN (Simeon & Levi)

Some sobering warnings to consider:

- 1. Anger solves no problems
- 2. Anger distances relationships
- 3. Anger is passed down generationally
